POSITION TITLE: : Commander, 150 Maintenance Group / Lt Col O-5 & above / AFSC: Open to all Officer AFSC.

LOCATION OF POSITION: 150 Special Operations Wing, New Mexico Air National Guard, Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: Open to presently employed AGR officers in the rank of Lt Col & above in the NEW MEXICO AIR NATIONAL GUARD.

DATE VACANCY EXISTS: Currently with a projected start date ASAP.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY FOR AGR TOUR:

Officer must meet requirements as outlined in AFOCD.

If medical exam is older than 30 days, applicant must submit an AF Form 895.

Submit applications on NGB Form 34-1.

Must meet the physical examination qualification outlined in Chapter 12, ANGI 36-101, and IAW AFI 48-123 Medical Examination and Standards.

Examination must have been conducted within 18 months before the date of entry on military duty.

Must meet and comply with weight standards at the time of entry into AGR duty.

Should be able to acquire 20 years of active duty prior to mandatory separation date.

Should be able to serve at least five (5) consecutive years in the AGR program prior to becoming eligible to receive military non-disability retirement or retainer pay.

Must not be eligible for, or receiving an immediate Federal (military or civilian) retirement

annuity.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: As a condition of employment, **selected** agrees to attend all Unit Training Assemblies and Annual Training deployments, special projects, and exercises when required, with his/her unit of assignment; applicant must be assigned to a Military UMD in the unit they support and UMD compatible AFSC prior to Active Duty Tour. The military uniform will be worn in accordance with AFI 36-2903.

Maintenance Group Commander

Specialty Summary: The primary purpose of this position is to serve as the Aircraft Maintenance Group Commander, with responsibility for directing, and managing the Aircraft Maintenance Group. It partners with the Wing Commander, as well as the Mission Support Group, and the Operations Group Commanders in planning, scheduling, and implementing an Operationally Risk Managed (ORM) flying program.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Collaborates with the Wing Commander and other group commanders to plan, develop and implement numerous long term plans to include: the Wing Strategic Plan (mission, goals, values, objectives, etc.), the Base Master Plan (facilities), Communications/Computer Plan (infrastructure capabilities/upgrade), the Vehicle Replacement Plan, Four Year Deployment Plan, Aircraft Modification Plan, Depot Input Plan, force management and recruiting/retention plans, weapon system conversions, base supplements to tasking operational plans.
- Through subordinate functional supervisors, directs and supervises staff and production functions affecting very complex high performance aircraft with a wide variety of high cost,

sophisticated systems, controlling approximately two thirds of base dollars.

- Plans, organizes, schedules, controls, and directs all unit aircraft maintenance resources to meet mission requirements.
- Plans, schedules, controls and directs the use of all resources to assure timely, effective and complete support of mission requirements.
- Plans and institutes fiscal policies to implement federal law and higher headquarters directives.
- Coordinates with the operations and maintenance groups to ensure an integrated approach to the solution of problems relating to availability of A/C, and the ability to conduct the military mission.
