LOCATION OF POSITION: 150 Special Operations Wing, New Mexico Air National Guard, Kirtland Air Force Base, New Mexico.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: Presently employed NMANG AGR members with a Minimum grade of O5 promotable to O6 and maximum grade of O6.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY FOR AGR TOUR:

Officer must meet requirements as outlined in AFOCD.

If medical exam is older than 30 days, applicant must submit an AF Form 895.

Submit applications on NGB Form 34-1.

Must meet the physical examination qualification outlined in Chapter 12, ANGI 36-101, and IAW AFI 48-123 Medical Examination and Standards.

Examination must have been conducted within 18 months before the date of entry on military duty.

Must meet and comply with weight standards at the time of entry into AGR duty.

Should be able to acquire 20 years of active duty prior to mandatory separation date.

Should be able to serve at least five (5) consecutive years in the AGR program prior to becoming eligible to receive military non-disability retirement or retainer pay.

Must not be eligible for, or receiving an immediate Federal (military or civilian) retirement

annuity.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: As a condition of employment, **selected** agrees to attend all Unit Training Assemblies and Annual Training deployments, special projects, and exercises when required, with his/her unit of assignment; applicant must be assigned to a Military UMD in the unit they support and UMD compatible AFSC prior to Active Duty Tour. The military uniform will be worn in accordance with AFI 36-2903.

1. Specialty Summary. Commands and directs administration, training, and employment of a Wing

2. Duties and Responsibilities: Directly and through Group and Squadron Commanders, incumbent determines unit goals which are the foundation for long and short range planning and execution of all unit programs, and provides focus for all unit functions and activities. Ensures goals coincide with national, regional, and state military strategies and local limitations. Considers factors such as current and future mission needs, political climate, environmental concerns, area demographics, and regional and inter-agency (state and federal). Accommodates a variety of non-traditional military roles and missions such as foreign military exchanges and training with National Guard Bureau (NGB) and State sponsored Partnership for Peace initiatives augments active Air Force training, disaster relief, and drug interdiction. Incumbent is also responsible for general oversight and support of tenant organizations and geographically separated units. Operates as Installation Commander at an Air National Guard Installation responsible for real property, physical security and Anti-Terrorism/Force Protection (AT/FP) requirements. Provides guidance, resources, and other support to Texas State Military Department agencies including Joint-tasked organizations, and Joint Force Headquarters. Communicates and coordinates items of interest and potential adverse impact at the highest levels of national, state, and local political leadership. Represents the Air National Guard and state to foreign, political and military dignitaries including heads of state. Coordinates policies, plans, programs, and requirements at the senior leadership levels of the Air Force, Major

Command, wartime gaining commands, National Guard Bureau, and the Adjutant General's Office. Serves on a broad range of committees and boards which formulate recommendations on policy, resource allocation, future planning, and local governmental agencies such as Homeland Security, law enforcement, emergency management, and others on matters of operation and environmental safety, protection of resources, and dignitaries and other issues of possible unit impact.
